

1965-1966

The Treasurer reported that as of the meeting date there were 55 paid memberships (Eight more have been added since that time.)

The County recommends that all windows within 50 feet of a road be shuttered, or suffer the fate of one of our members who discovered his kitchen full of snow. The snow plows throw the snow a maximum of fifty feet and windows within that range will suffer. Also the County is not responsible for windows broken in this manner.

REPORT FROM SERENE LAKES CLUB

- Nevada County has committed itself to paving the last section of County road provided the SVH Corp. assist engineering problems and in obtaining of rights-of-way.
- Repairs and improvements to the water and sewer systems are being undertaken
- The Water District is contracting for a hydrologist to survey the club property with the view of the complete development of water resources
- Camping and trailer facilities will be fully developed. The rope tow is being moved to the new ski hill which is just south of the meadow on the county road.

REPORT FROM SERENE LAKES CLUB

The horse stables have been moved to the meadow area east of the County road. A recreation area will replace the old stables area. Tennis and handball courts are being considered. For safety reasons horses are no longer permitted on the County roads.

Serene Lakes Days will take place August 9, 10, and 11. The program will be similar to last year except more events will take place on Sunday. The Club is also planning a luau for later in the summer, date to be announced soon.

SERENE LAKES' FIRST CABIN TOUR

For those property owners who have bought lots but not yet put up a cabin, SLPOA will sponsor a Cabin Tour from 10 A.M. to 12 noon on September 1st. Ten cabins will be open which present a variety of approaches to building snow-country cabins. Cabin tourists will be able to ask questions as to what owners might do differently, what they are most pleased with, etc. A map locating the cabins will be on the back of each ticket, which may be purchased for a 50 cent donation per person at any of the cabins on tour. Money raised at this event will go toward constructing a boat-launching ramp and playground on the Water District property at the end of the upper lake.

CHICKEN HOLDS OUT

Over 200 persons attended SLPOA's annual meeting September 1st, and 540 dinners were served at the BBO following it. At the First Annual Cabin Tour held in the morning, 182 tickets were sold with a total of \$91 taken in for the SLPOA treasury.

WINTER OF 1968-69

Just before "going to press" (Thursday, January 30th), we called Mr. Fisher for his most current analysis of the snow situation. At Serene Lakes there are banks of snow up to 25 feet, 4-5 feet of new snow, and only the main road is open. It is snowing presently, a new storm is forecast for the weekend, and the highway conditions are uncertain. Four inches of snow fell overnight at Auburn. Mr. Fisher feels that with the additional burden of Tahoe being snowed in, they may be unable to do anything but keep the main County road open and will have to leave the remaining roads snowed in. One of the problems is that the banks are so high the equipment cannot blow the snow over.

SERENE LAKES CLUB ACTIVITIES

Color TV is now installed in the Club lounge, When the snow has melted, outside facilities will be completed. The Club bar will open again for full service on June 1st, and a cocktail hour from 4:30 to 5:30 will feature drinks for 50 cents.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

Bill Enkeboll, Chairman, and his architectural review committee consisting of Bill Anderson and Gene Walton, request that persons planning to build this summer should submit their plans to SLPOA as early as possible, and the architectural review committee will check them for compliance with subdivision covenants and deed restrictions. Plans also must be submitted to the Placer County building inspection department, which reviews for compliance with the County code.

1974-75

In the ten year history of SLPOA this may turn out to be one of its most significant and historic meetings. The deterioration of the clubhouse to a repugnant situation resulting in its closure; the threatening and near-arrest of beach users, people who bought property with the understanding that they and their guests were entitled to such; the severe cut in snow removal services to take place this winter; the delinquent taxes of the developer and the failure of the Water District's request for an essential tax increase, leaving cabin owners faced with a drastic increase in service fee in the near future - these are among the reasons why SLPOA urgently solicits your membership for the next year and your active support and participation in any way your time may permit.

SAVE OUR BEACH

Don Scoble, Chairman of S.O.B., prepared the following current statement: "The SAVE OUR BEACH committee met for its fourth consecutive meeting on August 10th. The major topic under consideration with Attorney Steven Lieberman was the matter of access to the beach adjacent to the clubhouse. Our attorney reported that he is in active negotiations to clarify the rights of all Serene Lakes property owners with respect to access to the beach.

WATER DISTRICT DEVELOPMENTS

Our Water District has entered into an agreement with Donner Summit P.U.D. to export our sewage to that area. This was possible as a result of the major water and sewer system improvements now being undertaken by Donner, all of which are being financed with the aid of a 70 per cent Federal grant. This will provide a long range solution to our sewage problem and will be much less costly than going it alone.

WHERE LIGHTNING STRIKES

On a weekday afternoon in late August lightning struck a dead tree on the west side of Lake Serena, and immediately flames flared up. Within minutes the sound of timber crackling as it burned could be heard, even across the lake. Fortunately, the Bill Greens, whose cabin adjoined the vacant land on which the fire began, were in their cabin and saw the fire as it started. Within a short time Tom Egan with the water district's pumper and the Forest Service were at the scene, and in about an hour and a half the fire was out.

OUR PLACE IN THE SUN AND ON THE SAND

Jackie Temple is working with Ray Tewell on plans for developing lot 1 into a useable beach and recreation area. SLPOA can lease the lot for \$1.00 a year, but volunteers are needed for any number of jobs and supplying of materials. We need sand, grading equipment, cement blocks for a barbecue, chemical toilets, and lots of elbow grease. Provision must also be made for garbage, insurance, and safety because of the fairly steep drop. A cheese shop has opened on the Soda Springs left-hand corner turning into Serene Lakes, supplying home-made bread, sandwiches, and a variety of cheeses. As of April 1st Lyla and Oren Horst became the owners of Donner Trail grocery store and trailer park. Fresh meat and produce will come in 2 to 3 times a week. As of June 5th the store will be open from 8 A.M. to 9 P.M. Sunday through Thursday. Friday and Saturday hours will be from 8 A.M. to 10 P.M

ROYAL SERENE LAKES NON-YACHT CLUB

DONNER SUMMIT AREA ASSOCIATIOIN

RESCUE AT BLACKWALL.

Two Serene Lakes residents, Steve Lieberman and Steve Beucus, were among six volunteer firemen who made an early morning rescue of two young Grass Valley men from Blackwall on the eastern side of Donner Summit on September 27th. The climbers had reached the three-quarter mark when it became dark, so they decided to spend the night, not realizing how cold it was. Their shouts, heard by Norm and Betsy Wilson, sent the Donner Summit Volunteer Fire Department's rock rescue team on its way to where they were suspended about 250 feet from the bottom of the cliff, a little over 150 feet from the top.

WHY DOES LAKE VAN NORDEN LOOK THAT WAY?

PG&E has scheduled hearings on November 18th in regard to repair of the dam. The lake was drained in August because PG&E wanted to work on it to prevent a small amount of leakage around the dam, which was built in 1908, earthen filled. However the State Division of Dams wanted the work to go to bedrock 40 feet below soil, which may turn out to be too expensive. The lake probably will be unfilled next summer and might revert to meadow.

DEVELOPMENT BOOM?

Nevis Industries (our new developers) have submitted to our Water Board and the Placer Co. Planning Department plans for a 288 lot development East of Baker Ranch-Soda Springs Road starting where the stables used to be (by the meadow), going down toward the Lodge and back over the hill. In addition to home sites is a proposed ski lift and day lodge! There are no plans for an additional or alternate egress to Serene Lakes. 1980

From the Santa Rosa Press Democrat:

"Contamination warnings for the Serene Lakes near Donner Pass in the Sierra have been posted by Placer County health authorities. Health Director Martin Winston said drinking water was contaminated by sewage that was washed by rain into the lakes from a spill at a lift station. The spill occurred in January and an outbreak of gastroenteritis in the area led officials to have the water sampled. Laboratory tests confirmed the contamination and residents were advised to use only bottled water or boil lake water before ingesting it."

CABLE T.V.

Just when most of the kinks have been ironed out of the cable TV system, more equipment has been stolen from the shed on top of Rowton Peak. It was also discovered that someone was shooting at the shed and the lock on the door with a 22 rifle. 4-wheel drive tire tracks and cartridges from the rifle were found and the police are investigating the matter. SNOW

This years snow fall of 611.5 inches is the 2nd highest in recorded history, topped only by the winter of 1952. The snow pack of 138 inches while pretty deep didn't set any record. The storm starting March 27th and running through April 8th dumped 181 inches at the recording station at Norden, and we get about 24 inches more than that. This last storm gave us an additional 181 inches of the white fluffy stuff. We didn't see a plow for a week, and nothing moved! Then everyone had to come up to see, and made the situation almost impossible for the clean-up crews. Those who made it up here in spite of all the warnings couldn't get out because, lo and be-

hold, we got a warm rain Easter weekend and the Yuba River flooded the bridge and made it impassable for almost 2 days. It took about 32 charges of dynamite to free up the ice dam below the bridge so the river could resume its normal flow. .There will be many stories told about the storm of '82 in the years to come. Those of us living here year round spent all our time shoveling, plowing, and moving cars. Some of us couldn't keep ahead of things, and lost driveways and snow tunnels. We even lost some cars. The plowing at its best was pretty terrible, but at the storms highest peak, even the County plows (if they were here) would have bogged down. We were totally isolated for 8 straight days. Most of us had plenty of wood, food and booze, and were comfortable. It really is essential if you have a cabin up here to keep it stocked with enough staples powdered milk, bottled water, candles, fire wood etc. to last at least 2 weeks, and a months supply is ideal. We had some people stuck up here who ran out of food. They alled for emergency rations to be brought in by snowmobile!

On the lighter side, Stew and Lynn Treon came up on March 27 to spend a week in their cabin, and were to proceed on to So. Shore for their daughters wedding on April 3rd. Like the rest of us, they got snowed in, and, like the rest of us, kept waiting for the snow plows which never came. Meanwhile, daughter is frantic; Mother and Father are frantic; wedding can't be postponed; bride and groom are at So. Shore; Mom and Dad are stuck in Serene Lakes, and as if that wasn't bad enough, the Bridal gown was also stuck in Serene Lakes with Mom and Dad! A real emergency right? You bet! Not life and death, but an emergency all the same. We couldn't get them out to Soda where Amtrack was picking up passengers. The groom arranged for a helicopter to pick them up on the lake, but the weather was too chancy. Finally they contacted Norm Saylor who chugged with his blower and guided them out Thursday night April 1st.

DSPUD MORATORIUM

The sewer hook-up ban was extended on Feb. 8 and will be reviewed again in late Spring. At April meeting Bob Franklin will have latest information from CCWD and the DSPUD Facilities Plan. Water board meeting has been changed from March 14 to March 28.

Snowmobiles are not allowed on the lake. As unlicensed vehicles they may be used on private property with consent of the owner. SLCWD has informed the sheriff that the water district does not want snowmobiles on their property and the sheriff will enforce.

SNOW TUNNELS

PROPANE TANKS

As we have written in previous letters, improperly installed propane tanks create a very dangerous situation in Serene Lakes. Placer County has passed an emergency ordinance regarding propane tanks. One provision of the ordinance requires that tanks must have marker stakes color coded with the propane suppler installed by Oct. 15, 1983. The Donner Summit Fire Department has brought it to our attention that very few tanks in Serene Lakes comply with this requirement..

1985

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SNOW REMOVAL AND PARKING

According to State Vehicle Code, the county has the right to restrict and govern parking regulations in snow areas. Therefore, we must comply with 1) the posted no parking signs on those streets so designated for offstreet parking this year, and 2) must still observe the alternate parking days on those streets where parking is still allowed. Those cabins on the no parking streets should contract for snow removal 'with a contractor having an encroachment permit with county.

Just a reminder that Placer County requires that snow tunnels must be removed by the first part of June. Because of the heavy snows last year the county did not enforce this ordinance. They have advised us that they will vigorously enforce the ordinance this year.

CONGRATULATIONS

A belated congratulations to Biathlete, Lyle Nelson, a competitor in the Winter Olympics, who recorded the top time for an American in the 20-K biathlon. It was such a surprise to see his picture in the Jan. 30, issue of TIME and even a mention of Serene Lakes. SIERRA LAKES COUNTY WATER DISTRICT

A contract for 1987 sewer construction and repair (to enlarge the main line to the treatment plant and repair sewers where needed) was awarded. Bonds were sold to cover our share of this project and of the recent enlargement of the sewage treatment plant, which is owned and operated by the Donner Summit Public Utility District (DSPUD), but serves both areas. In response to a contractual dispute between the two districts, SLCWD brought suit against DSPUD to protect its rights. The merits of this suit were hotly debated.

Subsequently, it was decided that the dues increase should only apply to cabin owners, and so it was decided to recommend to the membership a change in the bylaws to create two classes of members; cabin owner members, and lot owner members, with annual dues of \$50 and \$25, respectively. Creation of supplementary membership in cabins with more than one owner or owner-couple, and non-voting "Friends of SLPOA" was also discussed.

LOT 1 BUILDING

Such purposes are pleasure, recreation and other nonprofitable purposes." At the last board meeting it was agreed unanimously to attend the court hearing to show majority member approval.

We need to own our own equipment and we desperately need a place to store it. We have been borrowing cooking equipment, barbecues, shade tarps, speaker equipment, etc. We do own a fence, volleyballs, horseshoes, and a few picnic tables and benches. All these items need to be stored! Thanks to the Sierra Lakes County Water District, they have allowed us to temporarily use their extra storage space. By the end of next summer I am confident that our building will be in place and functional. Think positive.

1993

TREASURER'S 1993 BUILDING FUND UPDATE

The goal of the SLPOA membership for a recreation building on Lot 1 is moving along. Construction will begin this summer. At the annual meeting September 6. 1987, the SLPOA membership voted to increase the dues of cabin owners by \$25/year and dedicate the increase for a recreation building. SLPOA board action on April 17, 1993 authorized a separate account as a Building Fund. During the past six years, the increased dues, plus savings from operations. interest earned, and profits from merchandise sales have been accumulating. On May 15, 1993, the SLPOA board authorized the transfer of these funds to the new Building Fund account. As of July 1993, the total in the fund exceeds \$35,000 .

MORE QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

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Here are some questions we were asked during Serene Lakes Days: When is the lodge going to open? The lodge will be open to the public for dinner on August 18th. From then on, the dining room will be open daily for breakfast, lunch and dinner. The Grand Opening is slated for September 2nd.

PERCH - IN SERENE LAKES?

Someone claimed to have found some perch in Serene Lakes last summer and the evidence was delivered to the Department of Fish and Game who then conducted an electrofishing survey. In the past DFG has stocked the lakes with Brook Trout and Brown Trout. The survey took four hours. They captured 20 Golden Shiner of 2-3" and sighted another 200, 42 Brown Bullhead of 3-7" and sighted another 500+, and 8 Brook Trout of 4-8" and another 17 not captured. The also caught two crayfish about 4" and saw another 15. No Yellow Perch were found.

NEW DOCK AT SIERRA

The boat dock at the end of the boat ramp on Sierra has been there for years. Last summer a good citizen volunteered to remake the dock if SIPOA would pay for the materials. The new dock will be forty five feet long with a 10 foot T at the end. It will be anchored with cables to weights so the wind doesn't put it around. This will be Steve Muff 's Eagle Scout project.

Old man winter took a while getting here, but when he arrived it was with a vengeance. Richard Gau and the guys at the water district report that there were 127 inches of snow in January, and February brought 186 more. During the first half of March we received 37 inches of the white stuff, bringing the season total at Serene Lakes to 397 inches. According to the Sierra Sun we have had five consecutive wet winters in the Sierra.

THERE'S SOMETHING FISHY HERE - Gordon Steindorf to the Rescue The Department of Fish and Game surveyed the fish population in Serene Lakes determined that the fish population consisted primarily of shiners and bullheads, which are "trash fish". The "trash fish" out compete more desirable fish such as trout and prevent any fish from growing to any good size. DFG suggested that we stock them with trout of the two to the pound size. Trout of that size would out compete the other fish and provide local anglers with some fun.

The beams and posts were pre-cut and stored in the Lot 1 building while holes were dug and concrete was poured for each of the post footings. Everything would be ready for assembly in the spring. He dug two 20 feet deep holes into the snow to reach the footings and figured he would use the snow as natural scaffolding. Each post was hauled across the snow, slowly lowered into the cavernous holes and attached to the footings. More snow fell. The next step was to attach the cross beams. More posts were hauled across the snow and bolted together. More snow fell, but the structure was complete.

THE GREAT SNOWS OF 2011

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The California Department of Water Resources measured 740 inches of snow at Donner Summit by the end of March, the third highest amount on record, marking the fourth winter that snowfall has surpassed 700 inches since 1879. The heavy snowpack snapped power poles, interrupted electric service, and broke propane tank pipes. Propane leaks at homes and one explosion gave rise to a unified command to manage the situation, resident placards, abatement notices, evacuation center, and community meeting at Judah Lodge. Leaks have continued to a total of 38 as the snow melts, compacts, and slides and the ice encasing the propane melts.

LAND TRUST ANNOUNCES 2013 FOREST THINNING WORK

At the firehouse meeting on July 6 for Serene Lakes residents, the Truckee Donner Land Trust announced the location for the forest thinning project to be completed in the fall of 2013. The Land Trust released a map of a 115 acre parcel designated for "fuel reduction" work. The 2013 project will be the first phase of a multi-year effort to build a ¼ mile "shaded fuel break" around our subdivision. Work will begin after Labor Day.

NEW SEWER PLANT: ON LINE, ON TIME, ON BUDGET

December 31 the DSPUD takes complete ownership of the new sewer plant in Soda Springs. The \$25 million plant will be "substantially" completed next month and finally completed in December. Then it will be a matter of fine tuning things for optimal operation and that will take another six months.

WATER DISTRICT TO RE-EVALUATE LAKE MANAGEMENT PLAN

When the Water District acquired the lake bottom parcel from the Land Trust, it also took on the responsibility of managing the community's most valuable asset. The Citizens' Committee, formed by the Water District Board to solicit community advice and develop a plan met many times over the summer. The plan covers access to the lakes, boat storage, rules for on lake residents and off lake residents, boat registration for parking on District property, docks and piers, and activities allowed at the various access points.
