

Ragnar Relay Returns July 20-21 By Ann Reisenauer

The Ragnar Relay on July 20-21 will be the largest event held on the summit this summer.

The race's format will be similar to last year. Most runners will arrive Thursday July 19 and park in the Soda Springs Ski Area lots. The runners and their gear will be shuttled to the tent village at Summit Station where they will camp Thursday and Friday nights.

The 24-hour trail relay begins Friday morning and ends Saturday afternoon. About 2,500 runners will compete this year. Only one member of a team runs at a time and the runners are spread out over 3 courses on Royal Gorge trails. You can still use the trails, but you'll see a lot of runners. Please be considerate.

Traffic advisory: For the past 2 years, there has been bumper-to-bumper traffic on Soda Springs Road on Thursday afternoon. To ease the congestion this year, Ragnar has developed a new, improved parking plan – let's hope it works. John Svahn of the Truckee Donner Land Trust says this will be their last chance to get the parking and traffic right.

NO PARKING ZONE: To keep the roads open for emergency vehicles, avoid parking along Pahatsi and Hillside Roads near Summit Station.



Royal Gorge Trails

The Truckee Donner Land Trust has completed most of the trail construction around Serene Lakes and is shifting its efforts to trail maintenance. This summer they are planning to install 24 directional signs on the trails and to update the Royal Gorge trail maps on their web site. To find the maps, go to tdlandtrust.org, click on the "Plan your Visit" tab at the upper right, then scroll down to "Royal Gorge."

Recommended hike: For spectacular views, hike the new section of the Point Mariah trail. It climbs from the Sterling's Canyon trail to the ridge where it winds through hoodoos and other volcanic formations before rejoining the trail to Point Mariah.

Memorial Overland Emigrant Trail

Placer County is working with TDLT and the Forest Service to construct a section of the Memorial Overland Emigrant Trail through Royal Gorge this summer. The three-mile section west of Soda Springs Road and parallel to Pahatsi Road is shovel-ready; construction may start as early as August. When completed, the Overland Emigrant Trail will follow the original wagon route from Donner State Memorial Park to Kingvale.

The long-range plan is to connect the Royal Gorge trail network with Sugar Bowl trails, the Memorial Overland Emigrant Trail and the Pacific Crest Trail.

Trailheads: There are Sani-Huts at the Hoelter-Hall and Summit Station trailheads again this summer thanks to SLPOA and TDLT. Moreover, TDLT is looking into the feasibility of building permanent pit toilets.


SERENE LAKES PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION New Bench on Thauvette's Frolic By Ann Reisenauer

Margie Powell Hike, 2018 August 11&12



Margie Powell was the inspiration for the Donner Summit Historical Society. She was also the energy behind the founding. In her memory we've held annual Margie Powell hikes in August. Our hikes have gone down Summit Canyon, up to Roller Pass, around Van Norden, and around Serene Lakes. We've covered the Lincoln Highway, the Emigrant Trail, Native Americans and what they've left behind, the 1914 underpass, Tunnel 6, snowsheds, Van Norden Dam, Soda Springs (the original and Soda Springs Station), ice harvesting

On this, our seventh year, we're going to tour mostly on the north side of Old Highway 40, Donner Pass Rd. Of course the walk will be illustrated with dozens of historic photographs and lots of stories.

This year will be very ambitious for the number of stories to tell. We'll be starting at the Donner Ski Ranch parking lot and talking about Tunnel 6, the Summit Hotel and the railroad facilities right there. Then we'll cross Donner Pass Rd. and talk about Sierra Junipers, the transcontinental air route (and the remains of the weather station buildings where there is a CREAT view - see above), the Catfish Pond or Maiden's Retreat, the idea that the north side of Old 40 was the Emigrant Thail (see photograph below of Thails West maker there) and possible proof, the recent report of cadaver dogs and Donner Party, down and around to Old 40, Donner Pass Rd and across to the petroglyphs, China Wall, up the old Lincoln Highway to the PCT trailhead, and back to the start.

Do not consider going on this hike unless you are nimble because there are parts where we'll have to scramble over some rocks since there is no trail.
